Once again this year, Pioneer Cottage featured in the Sunshine Coast Open House weekend on Saturday, 21st October, where buildings of architectural interest, old and new, were open to the public.

Janet Baker provided a very interesting handout highlighting architectural items of interest for visitors to note as they toured the building. A special thanks to Janet for also ensuring posters of the Cottage over the years were on view.

BHS was honoured to receive a visit from Melissa Hoedel, Executive Director, Brisbane Open House (accompanied by her daughter) and Peter and Jenny Wyatt from Melbourne. Peter was a guest speaker at the Sunshine Coast Council's Forum on The Story of Sunshine Coast Architecture, held the night before the Open House weekend. Thanks very much to John Deevers (who was taking Peter and Jenny on an Open House tour) for making Pioneer Cottage the first stop!

# **Lucky Winner!**

# **Sunshine Coast Council Grants**

Sunshine Coast Council has notified BHS of the success of the application for funds to purchase and install a touch screen and hard drive in the museum room at Pioneer Cottage. The touch screen will provide a means of giving museum visitors the chance to look through the significant historical photos in BHS' photographic collection. BHS member Ross Eason with assistance from other BHS members is currently re-digitising these photos for display through the touch screen.

The touch screen will also provide a means of making other historical material in the BHS collection available for public viewing.

BHS is also waiting for news on whether the application under the Council's Collection Care program to restore selected artwork and prints has been successful.

# **Donation of Guys Siding Switch Mechanism**

BHS member and member of Buderim's Guy family, Jeanine Roberts, has recently donated the switch mechanism for the Buderim tramway catchpoint at Guys Siding. It has been in the Guy family's possession since the dismantling of the tramway in 1935, initially saved by Jim Guy and then preserved by his son Ivan – Jeanine's father.

In researching the provenance of the item, it was manufactured by the British railway manufacturing firm, McKenzie & Holland, at its foundry in Northgate, Brisbane. The foundry was established in 1897 and supplied infrastructure for railways and tramways around Australia. It also supplied the rivets for Brisbane's Story Bridge and later played a role in manufacturing munitions during World War Two.

The weighted end of the switch mechanism was used to shift the tracks to enable trains to divert from the main tramway track into Guys Siding.

When Keith Guy gave his recent presentation on Jim and Connie Guy, he brought along a photo of Guys Siding which shows the switch mechanism in position. Consideration is being given as to how best to display it at Pioneer Cottage.



# **Arbour in Buderim Village Park**

It has been pleasing to see the Sunshine Coast Council's completion of the new arbour in the Buderim Village Park, organised by the Buderim Garden Club to celebrate its 75th anniversary. BHS was initially approached in March 2021 to suggest historical images that might help communicate Buderim's agricultural and horticultural history. Earlier this year we also proofed some of the history text.

# **Interpretation Plan for Pioneer Cottage**

As reported last month, the Sunshine Coast Council has selected the BHS to obtain expert assistance to develop an interpretation plan to guide the museum layout in Pioneer Cottage. BHS will get four sessions with Josh Tarrant from the Queensland Museum to help us take our Interpretation planning (story telling through different mediums) to the next stage, building on Stage 1 of the Interpretation Plan completed in 2018.

We will be looking at how best to give members the opportunity to contribute their thoughts and ideas during the process with Josh.

# **Indexing BHS Historical Records**

New BHS member Madeline Roche, who has a tertiary degree in museum studies, has completed her initial volunteer training with Ruth Ormerod and is now working with Janet Baker to review and index the contents of the local history folders in the BHS collection of historical resources. Having an index will enhance the Curatorial Team's ability to pull together resources from across the collection – documents, photographs and objects – to respond to enquiries about Buderim's history, requests for presentations and to create temporary themed displays.

# Old Buderim Families with Connections to India

We have recently had contact with descendants of two Buderim pioneering families with connections to India

A recent visitor to Pioneer Cottage was Denise Iscak, daughter of Buderim resident Henry Iscak. Denise grew up in the family home in Fielding St and was very pleased to find a number of items relating to the Iscak family on display, including the sugar mill evaporation pan donated by Henry.

His father Mohamet Iscak, born in Delhi, India, had initially come to Buderim in the late 19<sup>th</sup> century to work in the sugar mill established by Joseph Dixon and John Fielding. In the early 1900s he was the man responsible for planting the fig trees in Wirreanda Park for the Smyth family.

We also heard recently from Michelle Selwood, a great-granddaughter of Sion and Hannah Singh. Michelle made contact to track down a 2007 book on the Singh family "India to Buderim Mountain", a copy of which is in the BHS library.

More on the story of the Iscak and Singh families can be found in Bill Lavarack's book, Stories of Old Buderim. Bill has also extensively covered the sporting contribution of Mahomet Iscak's sons, Henry and William, in his book, *History of Sport in Buderim: the First Hundred Years*.

There is also another book on the Singh family, "Sion Singh: a Sikh pioneer: Buderim Queensland", published in 2017 by the Australian Indian Historical Society. It is available online through the State Library of Queensland and the National Library of Australia.

We are looking forward to further contact with Denise and Michelle in telling the story of their families' contribution to the history of Buderim.

# From the Archives - A Cheeky Buderim Joke

Found in the BHS archives - the Buderim Community Bulletin was produced towards the end of the Second World War to give locals away on war service (referred to as "Digs and Diggerettes") all the gossip from Buderim. A cheeky joke in the July 1945 edition was as follows —

Said one strawberry to the other, "If I hadn't been in the same bed as you, I wouldn't now be in this jam. Oh!"

Life wasn't all hard work for Buderim's strawberry growers!
